CAPITAL GRANTS OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS

Capital grants aim to provide £150 million of funding to farmers, land managers and rural businesses for practical environmental improvements across England.

These improvements can include planting hedgerows, managing boundaries, improving water and air quality, restoring habitats, and introducing natural flood management measures.

As of the 29th of July just over 75% of the available funding has now been allocated. Once the remaining budget is allocated applications will close. So get your applications in! A new round of funding is expected to open in 2026 if you are not successful in securing funding in this round.



BLUE TONGUE VIRUS UPDATE

The total number of BTV-3 cases in Great Britain for the 2025 to 2026 vector season is 7. All cases have been in England. The risk of transmission via infected midges is now considered to be very high in England and most of Great Britain.

During July, 4 cases of Blue tongue were confirmed across Wiltshire, Cumbria, Oxfordshire and Norfolk.

As of 1 July 2025 the restricted zone for bluetongue has been extended to cover all of England. You can move animals within England without a specific bluetongue licence or pre-movement testing. For more information on the current blue tongue virus situation click here.
